Over the last 10 years, our presence has steadily expanded, reaching distant communities with diverse needs and unique challenges. What makes this progress meaningful is not just the breadth of that reach, but the consistency behind it. Each year has built upon the last, allowing programs to deepen, partnerships to strengthen, and outcomes to compound over time.

The result is a body of work that reflects sustained effort rather than isolated moments of giving. From rural villages to developing urban centers, initiatives have been designed to create stability, improve quality of life, and open pathways to opportunity. These efforts demonstrate that long-term commitment is one of the most powerful drivers of meaningful change.

Today, that commitment is reflected in both scale and substance. With more than \$4 million donated, projects spanning 26 countries, and over 2.5 million lives touched, the Foundation's work demonstrates what is possible when purpose is paired with consistency. FOOD INSECURITY

“Over the past 10 years, more than 2.4 million meals have been provided to communities facing urgent need.”

Addressing food insecurity has required both immediate intervention and long-term thinking. Over the past ten years, you’ve helped provide more than 2.4 million meals to communities facing urgent need. You ensured that individuals and families have access to consistent nourishment during times of instability.

At the same time, our efforts have focused on building systems that support sustainability. We’ve supported a 5-acre community garden in the Philippines, as well as the construction of 4 hoop houses and the establishment of 12 community gardens in Cambodia, creating opportunities for ongoing food production and local self-reliance. These initiatives equip communities with the knowledge, tools, and resources needed to move beyond dependency and toward stability.

By combining relief with development, these programs create a more durable impact—one that continues to benefit individuals and families long after the initial intervention.

CLEAN WATER

Access to clean water has remained one of the most critical and transformative areas of focus over the past decade. Through the construction of **41 boreholes across Africa**, **435 wells in Cambodia**, and additional water collection and purification systems in Mexico and Haiti, more than **127,000 people now have reliable access to safe water**.

The impact of these efforts extends far beyond the immediate need. Clean water improves overall health outcomes, reduces the prevalence of waterborne illness, and creates a more stable foundation for daily life. It also restores time—particularly for women and children—allowing them to pursue education, work, and other opportunities that were previously out of reach.

Over time, these changes accumulate. Communities become healthier, more resilient, and better positioned for growth. What begins as infrastructure becomes a catalyst for long-term development.

EDUCATION

Education has consistently been one of the most impactful investments over the past decade, serving as a pathway to opportunity for thousands of individuals. Through the construction and restoration of five schools and expanded access to learning resources, more than 8,000 students have been given the opportunity to pursue education.

The Inta-Kara Vocational School in Ecuador stands as a powerful example of this work in action. With 510 graduates to date, the program offers training in five certification areas: Welding, Industrial Safety & Occupational Health, Electrical Work, Culinary Arts, and Mechanics. These programs provide practical, career-ready skills that enable graduates to secure employment, support their families, and contribute to their communities.

Beyond individual success, the impact of education extends across generations. As students gain skills and stability, they create new opportunities for those around them, reinforcing the long-term value of investing in learning.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Efforts to combat human trafficking over the past decade have focused on both prevention and direct intervention. Through strategic partnerships, the Foundation has supported **500 survivors**, contributed to the training of **9 specialized ESD K9 units** for law enforcement, and played a role in 100 arrests. Additionally, more than **1,000 individuals** in the Philippines have been educated on the risks and realities of trafficking.

This work reflects a comprehensive approach—one that addresses immediate threats while also building awareness and strengthening community-level prevention. Survivors receive support that extends beyond rescue, including access to care, resources, and opportunities to rebuild their lives in safe and stable environments.

Over time, these combined efforts contribute to a broader system of protection, creating safer communities and stronger responses to exploitation.

VISION CAMBODIA

Through a longstanding partnership with Vision Cambodia, significant progress has been made in expanding access to clean water and education in rural communities. Together, a total of **447 wells** have been constructed, providing reliable access to clean water for **4,470** individuals who previously faced daily challenges in securing this basic necessity.

In addition to water access, this partnership has supported the rebuilding of a primary school, creating a safer and more stable learning environment for local students. These combined efforts reflect a holistic approach—addressing both immediate needs and long-term opportunity. The 2020 expedition further strengthened this collaboration, deepening connections with the communities served and reinforcing a shared commitment to sustainable development.

TRUSTED PARTNERSHIPS



Over the past decade, the impact of the ASEA Advancing Life Foundation has been strengthened and scaled through meaningful partnerships with organizations around the world. Each partner brings deep local knowledge, trusted relationships, and a shared commitment to creating lasting change. Together, these collaborations have expanded access to essential resources, empowered communities, and built solutions designed to endure.



ENGAGE NOW AFRICA

Partnership with Engage Now Africa has focused on building foundational infrastructure and supporting long-term community development across multiple regions. This work has included the construction of a kindergarten, primary school, and junior high school, as well as the development of a primary school in Chainia, located in the Kassena-Nankana West District of Ghana's Upper East Region.

Access to clean water has also been a critical component of this partnership, with **21 wells** constructed across Sierra Leone and Ghana. Beyond infrastructure, efforts have extended into agricultural development through garden and animal husbandry programs in Sierra Leone. These initiatives equip women with practical skills in nutrition and food production, enabling them to better support their families and build more stable, self-sufficient households.

MOTHERS WITHOUT BORDERS

The partnership with Mothers Without Borders reflects a broad and multifaceted approach to community support, addressing both immediate needs and long-term development. One of the most impactful contributions has been the funding of a military transport truck, which plays a vital role in delivering food to schools and villages, transporting bicycles to students, and supporting on-the-ground expeditions.

Additional efforts have included rebuilding a four-classroom school block and supporting the expansion of the Children's Resource Center. This expansion has brought meaningful improvements, including renovated shower facilities, fencing, walkways, landscaping, fruit trees, gathering spaces, playgrounds, and additional living accommodations for children.

Ongoing support has also included funding operational expenses for the Carol Zulu School and sponsoring the Boys Empowerment Program in both 2024 and 2025. Together, these initiatives create safer, more supportive environments where children and families can learn, grow, and thrive.

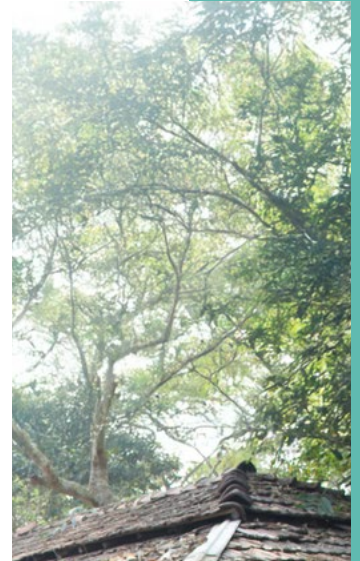


SPEAK UP FOR THE POOR

In Bangladesh, partnership with Speak Up For The Poor has created expanded access to education for young women who might otherwise face significant barriers, including child marriage or limited economic opportunity. Through the development and ongoing support of a college dormitory in Khulna city, students are able to safely pursue higher education while attending nearby colleges and nursing schools.

Since the partnership began in March 2022, the dormitory has grown from **40 residents to 175 young women** as of December 2025, reaching full capacity and remaining consistently utilized. In addition, housing support has been extended to 40 more students living in nearby hostels, ensuring that even more young women can continue their education.

This initiative represents more than access to housing—it creates a pathway to independence, professional careers, and long-term stability, impacting not only the students themselves but also their families and communities.



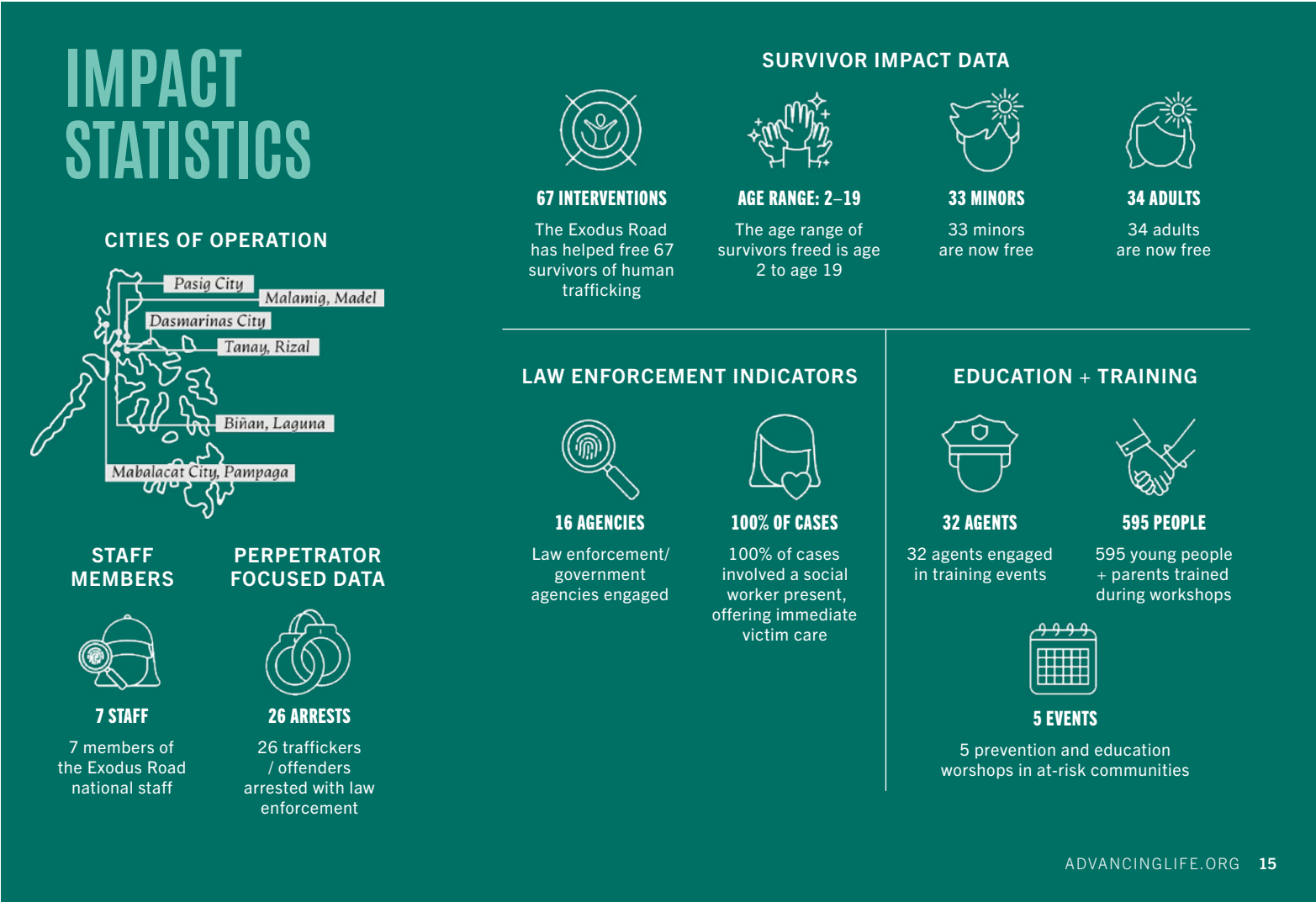


THE EXODUS ROAD

Efforts to combat human trafficking have been strengthened through partnership with The Exodus Road, supporting both prevention and survivor care across Asia. This work addresses one of the most urgent global challenges, focusing on protecting vulnerable individuals and creating pathways for recovery.

In 2024, support was directed toward anti-trafficking efforts in the Philippines, contributing to education and intervention initiatives. In 2025, funding supported the Freedom Home in Thailand, where 23 survivors, including both minors and adults, received comprehensive care through short- and long-term programs.

These programs focus on key areas essential to recovery, including economic self-sufficiency, social connection, emotional well-being, personal safety, and physical health. This approach ensures that survivors are not only rescued, but also supported in rebuilding their lives with dignity and stability.





WHO LIVES

Through partnership with Who Lives, significant progress has been made in expanding access to clean water and supporting community-driven development across Africa. A total of **26 boreholes** have been constructed, including projects in Uganda, Kenya, and Malawi, collectively serving tens of thousands of individuals.

Beyond water access, this partnership has supported a range of community development initiatives, including agricultural programs, microloans for small businesses, and resources such as chicken incubators. These efforts are designed to strengthen local economies, improve food security, and provide families with sustainable pathways to income and stability.

COOP FOR EDUCATION

Partnership with Coop for Education has focused on strengthening educational systems through literacy and technology initiatives. This work has included the implementation of **6 Sparks reading programs** in primary schools, where teachers are trained in effective literacy instruction and classrooms are equipped with dedicated libraries.

In addition, **4 computer labs** have been established in junior high schools, expanding access to technology and digital learning resources. These efforts provide students with essential skills that support both academic success and future opportunities. The 2023 expedition further reinforced this partnership, deepening engagement and support for local educators and students.

THE SALVATION ARMY

The Salvation Army has been a critical partner in providing rapid response during times of global crisis. In the aftermath of natural disasters, immediate access to food, water, and shelter is essential, and this partnership has helped deliver those resources when they are needed most.

By combining the Foundation's support with The Salvation Army's global infrastructure and on-the-ground expertise, communities are able to receive timely assistance that stabilizes conditions and supports recovery. This collaboration ensures that aid reaches those affected quickly and effectively during moments of greatest need.



CHOICE HUMANITARIAN

The partnership with Choice Humanitarian spans multiple regions and areas of impact, with a strong focus on sustainable community development. In Ecuador, this collaboration helped fund and build the Inta-Kara Vocational Center, which has now produced **510 graduates** equipped with practical, career-ready skills.

Beyond education, this partnership has supported agricultural and economic development initiatives, providing communities with resources such as beehives, seeds, tools, and training to support both farming and local tourism efforts. These programs are designed to create long-term economic opportunity and resilience.

Additional work includes projects within Navajo Nation communities, where **4 hoop houses were constructed to support local food production**, as well as initiatives in central Mexico's La Rincon community. There, efforts have included the construction of



4 water cisterns, 12 outdoor stoves, and 8 chicken coops—improving daily living conditions and supporting self-sufficiency.

Across each region, this partnership reflects a shared commitment to building solutions that are locally driven, sustainable, and designed to last.
